TEMPLE ADATH ISRAEL BUILDING CENTENNIAL



100 years on North Ashland

Temple Adath Israel will celebrate the 100th anniversary of our building with a months-long celebration that will culminate in 2026 with a rededication of the synagogue.

The kickoff event, which also will serve as a celebration of Rabbi Wirtschafter's 10th anniversary at TAI, is set for Friday, July 4, at the home/farm of Rebecca and Joe Young. It will include an outdoor Shabbat service, cookout, and fun and games for adults and kids. (Look for more details in upcoming emails.)

Also in the works is a Throwback Shabbat, probably in November, that

will feature the Union Prayer Book that was in widespread use when TAI held the first service in its new building on Feb. 19, 1926. Plans also include an oral history/multimedia project, projects that engage our Religious School students, and the possibility of replacing the seats in the sanctuary, whose best days are behind them. (No pun intended.)

Temple Adath Israel was chartered in 1904. The congregation purchased a building on Maryland Avenue in 1905 for use as its first permanent sanctuary.

That property was sold in 1924, when TAI purchased two lots on North Ashland for a total of \$7,500. Construction of the new temple began in 1925.

During the interim, TAI first held services and Religious School at the Masonic Temple on North Broadway. Services later were moved to Woodland Christian Church while Religious School remained at the Masonic Temple until the new synagogue was ready.


KOLLEL STUDY GROUP

TAI'S ENDOWMENT AT WORK

The cumulative value of TAI's endowment, which supplements the temple's financial needs, fell 0.49% in the first quarter of 2025. Endowment Committee Treasurer Stacey Myers-Wilson reported that disbursements totaling \$54,300 were made as follows (amounts rounded to the nearest \$100) through March 31:

- \$18,400 from Enrichment Fund; offset operating expenses.
- \$7.1K from Hineni Fund; offset operating expenses.
- \$7.1K from Sherman and Fannie Miller Memorial Fund; camp scholarships.
- \$6K from Rose Family Fund; offset cost of Confirmation Class trip.

■ \$6K from Rosenstein Family Fund; offset Religious School expenses.

■ \$3K from Bloomfield Family Fund; offset cost of LiveControl.

■ \$2.5K from Marilyn & Arthur Lieber Board Leadership Fund; offset cost of attending administrator conference.

■ \$1.8K from Abraham Music Fund for training/certification program for Jewish musicians

■ \$1.4K from Jayne Bolotin Memorial Fund to sukkah repair and replacement

■ \$1K from Perpetual Care Fund; care of nine gravesites at Lexington Cemetery




