### "Bluegrass Bridge"

Rethinking the Megillah in the Year of #Me Too

What makes this year's Megillah reading different than others? The Book of Esther hasn't changed, but the way we think about it is due for a major overhaul. From this year forward, our reading of the story of Purim will forever be informed by the painful realities of the Me Too campaign.

The Miss Persia pageant, the beauty contest through which Esther becomes queen<sup>1</sup>, has lost even more of its luster. Our Purim *schpiels* (skits, parodies) typically play this scene for laughs. Somehow it just doesn't seem to be "all in good fun" or innocent joking anymore. Looking at women *only* for their looks is a terrible way to look at them. It's demeaning, degrading and dehumanizing. What these "contests" do to participants and observers alike is to promote notions of body image that are unhealthy, unsafe and unnecessary. As the father of a teenage daughter coming of age in the era of "size zero," I'm deeply concerned about unrealistic and unwelcome designations that make it seem as if women need to starve themselves into looking attractive. Forgive me for a personal confession as a heterosexual male, married for more than 20 years: Real men like women with real bodies. And real bodies are inextricably linked to real thoughts, feelings, needs and desires.

We shouldn't excise the beauty contest from the Book of Esther or malign its protagonist for participating. It doesn't appear that she had much of a choice. We might ask ourselves how much choice today's contestants have, for that matter. What we should do is to take this opportunity, this Me Too moment, to emphasize the courage of the other heroine of the Purim story, Queen Vashti. When Vashti is ordered to dance before the king's friends wearing a royal diadem<sup>2</sup> (presumably *only* the royal diadem as in the pop song "You Can Leave Your Hat On<sup>3</sup>" of "Full Monty<sup>4</sup>" fame), she refuses to do so. She chooses defiance and dignity over submission and self-abasement. Pressured to be a "plaything" reduced to breasts and buttocks, she demands to be treated as "flesh and blood, just like [a] man.<sup>5</sup>" Like far too many women today who have been punished for speaking out, Vashti pays a terrible price for her refusal to be treated like a sex toy. We can honor her courage, and the voices of the Me Too movement, by protecting those who speak out from retaliation and holding the perpetrators of indecent behavior responsible for their actions. Viva Vashti!

### FROM THE PRESIDENT'S DESK Jonathan Miller, President

Perhaps that's why it came to no surprise for many of my Facebook friends to witness the costume that I wore to my staid law firm's holiday party: I was the living embodiment of a blue Chanukkah dreidel. As Frost Brown Todd Lexington's first Jewish Member-in-Charge, I also felt compelled to lead my Gentile colleagues in a menorah lighting ceremony. Unfortunately, I forgot to bring the latkes.

It's also no wonder that I am regularly stopped by my friends from politics, law or civic affairs to express their support for, and appreciation of, Rabbi David Wirtschafter's leadership in the community.

I first agreed to join the Temple's Board of Trustees to help lead the challenging process of identifying and selecting a new rabbi. It's no secret that I was instantly a fan of Rabbi Wirtschafter, who I remembered as the little kid in the prominent Lexington Jewish family that I so admired in my childhood. I've been excited to work with him closely on Temple matters; and I consider myself blessed to have his spiritual guidance.

But what has struck me recently is how quickly David has emerged as a leader in the Central Kentucky community. Of course, he has served as an eloquent and passionate voice for Jewish interests and the state of Israel during a time which we have seen an unfortunate uptick in anti-Semitism and anti-Zionism.

Where he has earned his most plaudits, however, is in his inter-faith work, building bridges among the faiths, fighting arm-and-arm for causes that all of our great religions share. I can't tell you how many people have stopped to tell me their appreciation that the Rabbi set such an eloquent tone in his opening prayer at this year's Martin Luther King Day breakfast.

In speaking out, Rabbi Wirtschafter has an important balance to set. Our Temple is filled with members from all sides of the ideological spectrum, so David wisely abstains from any partisan statements. This is obviously is a sensitive issue in a polarized political era, and the Rabbi has shown great humility in accepting feedback from concerned congregants, striving to strike a tone that unifies our sometimes divided opinions.

Meanwhile, these difficult times call out for a voice that can articulate the interests of the dispossessed, the needy, the elderly, the stranger – all of those whom we as Jews are commanded to respect, honor and support. Rabbi Wirtschafter understands that delicate balance, and helps serve as a beacon of Reform Jewish values while representing our entire congregation.

Rabbi David Wirtschafter leads from the heart, at a time where we really need more compassion. And Lexington is noticing.

The featured work on this concert is Chichester Psalms (1965) by Leonard Bernstein. Chichester Psalms juxtaposes vocal part writing most commonly associated with church music (including homophony and imitation), with the Judaic liurgical tradition. Bernstein specifically called for the text to be sung in Hebrew, using the melodic and rhythmic contours of the Hebrew language to dictate mood and melodic character. By combining the Hebrew with Christian choral tradition, Bernstein was implicity issuing a plea for peace in Israel during a turbulent time in the young country's history.

#### **ONE BOOK JEWISH LEXINGTON 2018**

Share your love for reading and Judaism!

Join us for an engaging discussion of Joseph Bau's memoir "Dear God, Have You Ever Gone Hungry?" on Sunday, February 11, at 1:30 p.m. at the Eastside Library Conference Room.

In a memorable scene in the film "Schindler's List," viewers witnessed the clandestine marriage of two Jews in the Plaszow concentration camp: Joseph and Rebecca Bau. Joseph Bau's memoir includes stories, poetry and drawings detailing his time during the Holocaust including the bombing of Krakow, the brutality of the concentration camps, and his experiences as #247 on the men's section of Schindler's List. With artistic irony and elegance, Bau balances the grimness of Holocaust events with the humor and resiliency that helped him and his wife survive.

After the war, Bau became an artist, author and Israel's first animator. Exhibitions of his work have appeared in Israel, Canada and the U.S.

An exhibition of his work is scheduled in April in Lexington as a part of the Jewish Community's celebration of Yom Ha'Atzmaut and Israel's 70<sup>th</sup> birthday.

### Max Young is off to Israel (Again)!

January 28th, 2018. I embark on my life changing journey to Israel. Again. This time including much more education. I will be attending a semester abroad through the URJ Heller High program. During my stay, I will be living and learning on Kibbutz Tzuba just outside of Jerusalem. Over the course of the 4 months that I'll be there, I will not only be taking the same classes as I would at Henry Clay, but also an immersive Jewish history class and a rigorous Hebrew course. Outside of the classroom, my classmates and I will be spending an average of 1-2 days a week on field trips, where we will be learning about the history of the land and our people. The program also includes a few week-long expeditions, one being a week in which the whole class flies to Poland, to learn about the Holocaust.
