2021 Temple Adath Israel Renovation

In March 2020, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Temple Adath Israel made the difficult decision to halt its indoor activities and shift congregational life to online Zoom programs and limited outdoor events. With our physical building closed, TAI's Board recognized that it was a good time to finalize plans for a much-needed building renovation.

TAI's last building renovation was more than 37 years ago when the Religious School wing and our social hall were built. This year, knowing the importance of a bringing a more modern and vibrant feel to the building, a dedicated group of congregants worked diligently to finish plans and implement improvements to TAI's lobbies, hallways, social hall, conference room, Sisterhood Lounge, and library.

We are grateful for these improvements, made possible through use of endowment funds, but the renovation is not quite complete, and we need your help! The first phase of the renovation included fresh paint, new ceiling tiles, flooring for the social hall and Sisterhood Lounge, and acoustic clouds in the social hall. The next step is to purchase new furniture, accessories, and additional art to complement what has already been done.



With the proceeds from this fundraising effort, we hope to add fresh and modern chairs, tables, and lounging areas to complete the incredible change already underway.



















Library


From Torah study to Music and Movement lessons during Religious School, TAI's library is a warm and multi-functional space that enhances Jewish life in Lexington.
