Let all who are hungry for rubbing elbows come and eat.

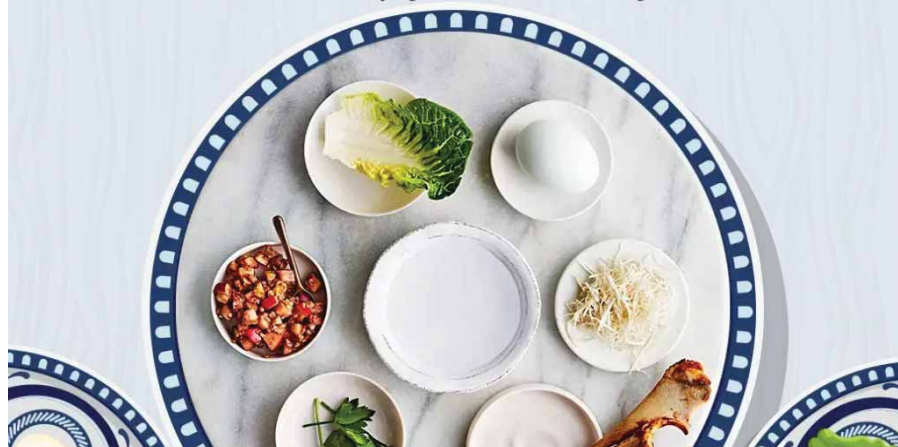

I'm a boxing fan. Like a boxer, COVID-19 came out strong in the early rounds. It left us dazed, perhaps even a

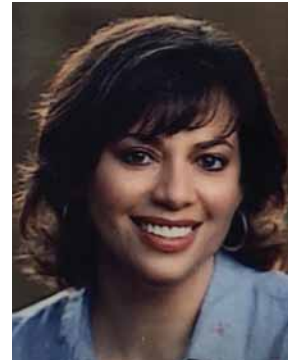
Passover is on the horizon, and I can't wait for it to get here! Everybody has a favorite Jewish holiday. Passover is mine.

and Jewish chaplain at the Center for Faith and Justice at Xavier. She came to the rabbinate after getting an undergraduate degree in government and economics and a master's in agricultural economics, and working in politics and as an urban conservationist with the USDA. As she found herself connecting more deeply with her Jewish faith, Lewis decided to enroll at Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion in Jerusalem and Cincinnati. She was ordained in 2005.

Lewis, who was born in New Jersey and raised on Galveston Island, Texas, considers herself a Jewish pluralist, valuing intra- and interfaith learning experiences. She has training in clinical pastoral education and served as a community-based rabbi and chaplain before joining the Center for Faith and Justice.

Programs tied to exhibits by Jewish artist, on female rabbis

■ Jewish artist Siona Benjamin, who creates cross-cultural and transcultural works, will be at Centre College in Danville on April 7 in conjunction with her exhibit there, “Beyond Borders: The Art of Siona Benjamin.”

The 7 p.m. event will include a talk by Benjamin about her work and a screening of “Blue Like Me,” a documentary short that highlights a Fulbright project Benjamin completed while traveling in India.

“Beyond Borders,” on display at Centre’s Norton Center through May, was curated by Shana Sippy. The April 7 event will be in Newlin Hall at the Norton Center.

■ A livestream reception and program for the art exhibit “Holy Sparks: Celebrating 50 Years of Women in the Rabbinate” is set for 6:30 p.m. Thursday, April 7. The exhibit, currently on display at the Dr. Bernard Heller Museum at Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion in New York, will move to the Skirball Museum

at HUC-JIR in Cincinnati for a 3½-month run starting May 19.

“Holy Sparks” illuminates the creativity, commitment, and vision of 24 women who were “firsts” in their time. Their challenges and contributions, struggles and successes represent the achievements of the nearly 1,500 female rabbis of all movements who have transformed Jewish tradition, worship, spirituality, scholarship, education and pastoral care.

The 6:30 p.m. program consists of a conversation among “the first four”: Rabbi Sally Priesand, the first woman ordained as a Reform rabbi in the United States (1972); Rabbi Sandy Eisenberg Sasso, the first woman ordained in the Reconstructionist movement (1974); Rabbi Amy Eilberg, the first woman ordained by the Conservative movement (1985), and Rabba Sara Hurwitz, the first Orthodox-ordained rabba (2009).

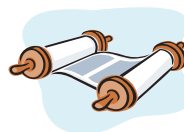
KOLLEL STUDY GROUP
