# Some days feel like I'm in a movie

# FROM THE PRESIDENT'S DESK



Rich Ornstein As I write this, Groundhog Day is a week away. One of America's greatest non-official holidays, built around a weather forecasting rodent, is also the title of one of the funniest movies of my college years. What is less funny, I now realize after 21 months as TAI president, is that this position is like being Bill Murray's *Groundhog Day* character, Phil.

I now understand, with five months to go in my tenure, that change doesn't happen easily at an institution

like Temple Adath Israel. The same people perform the same functions over and over. With some exceptions, the people who show up to help with any given event are the same ones who show up to help with the next event. Those who only want to tell you what you're doing wrong will let you know the next time what they think you're doing wrong. Those who complain and are offended every time you or someone else does something to help TAI or tries to help TAI, even after you bend over backward to help them while pretending to not take offense at their comments, will complain and be offensive the next time you or someone else does something to try to help TAI. This *Groundhog Day*-like adventure can get old, and you wonder whether being president is worth it. You think of the Tyrone Davis song "Turn Back the Hands of Time"

and wonder whether you would take on this role if you could have a do-over. For me, the answer is yes.

Temple Adath Israel is a magical place full of wonderful people. If I weren't president, I wouldn't know many of you. I wouldn't have experienced events like January's Martin Luther King Jr. Day Shabbat service. As president, I felt I needed to be at this service to greet our guest speaker, Fayette County Attorney Angela Evans. That service featuring, as Jonathan Miller noted, our own version of Peter, Paul and Mary — better known as Jerry Suhl, Lauren Hill and Lorne Dechtenberg — was magnificent. But just as memorable was spending a few minutes talking to new member David Kaufman, whom I met just recently when he volunteered to spend one Shabbat night every six to eight weeks as a security greeter. Meeting people like David is one of the things that makes being president worthwhile.

As I have written and said before, becoming a TAI volunteer, a board member and president has been one of my greatest experiences and accomplishments. I've expanded not only my social circle but my mind thanks to so many of you. Those of you who have shared your thoughts and experiences have made me a much better person. I hope those of you who read this will consider volunteering your time, attending an occasional service or activity or joining our board of directors. My only ask, for those of you who seem to enjoy being a critic, is that the next time you feel like lashing out, take a second and remember we that are a community and that the actions being taken, whether they turn out to be right or wrong, are not being done *to* you but *for* you and our community.

# Lunch & Learn features author reading



honor that recognizes "young, debut fiction writers whose work promises to leave a lasting impression on the literary landscape."
