## Tu BiShvat and recovery from SoCal wildfires

### FROM THE RABBI'S STUDY

February 13, known in the Jewish world this year as Tu BiShvat, the 15th of Shevat, is called the Birthday of the Trees. Just as we have a fiscal year, harvest year or calendar

year, so, too, there is a new year for the trees, a Jewish Arbor Day or Earth Day, if you will. In Israel, where it frequently rains all winter, the white blossom of the almond tree is regarded as an early sign of spring. Here at Temple Adath Israel, we typically include recognition of Tu BiShvat on the Friday closest to the actual date and our students have a Tu BiShvat seder at Religious School.

In the wake of the devastating wildfires that destroyed thousands of homes and trees throughout Southern California, this Jewish Arbor Day takes on renewed significance. The effects of climate change continue to wreak havoc in our country and on our planet. Planting trees, maintaining forests, rebuilding in a safe and sustainable way are essential steps in giving our children and grandchildren a beautiful and viable planet.

As our sacred texts teach us: "Just as my ancestors planted for me, so I will plant for my children" (Babylonian Talmud Taanit 23a). Please celebrate this year's Tu BiShvat with a donation to organizations such as The

A new endowment fund has been established at Temple Adath Israel thanks to the generosity of Harold Weinberg. The Lauren and Douglas Weinberg Temple Adath Israel Fund honors his late first wife and late son.

The Weinberg family joined TAI in 1979. Lauren served for many years as executive director of the National Conference of Christians and Jews, Bluegrass Region. Douglas grew up at TAI. Before his death, he was field director and principal supervisor for the Belize Valley Archaeological Reconnaissance Macal River Project.

by the TAI Board of Directors, which also will determine how the fund may be used. The fund may be spent to its exhaustion, but disbursements cannot begin until 2028. Money in the fund will be invested and overseen by the Endowment Committee in keeping with temple bylaws. Donations to the fund may be made by any individual, corporation, foundation, trust, estate or other legal entity through gifts, bequests or other gift vehicles.

The first Repro Shabbat was in 2021 and has been held annually since then. It is an initiative of the National Council of Jewish Women's Jews for Abortion Access program, which engages in nonpartisan efforts to educate the community about abortion and reproductive health issues, destigmatize abortion, and support bodily autonomy and religious freedom. Repro Shabbat coincides with the reading of Parshat *Mishpatim*, the portion of the Torah that contains verses used as the foundation of Judaism's approach to reproductive health, rights and justice.

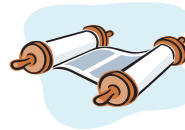
## KOLLEL STUDY GROUP

## TAI'S ENDOWMENT AT WORK

The cumulative value of TAI's endowment, which supplements the temple's financial needs, grew 9.17% in 2024. Endowment Committee Treasurer Stacey Myers-Wilson reported that disbursements totaling almost \$190,200 were made as follows (amounts rounded to the nearest \$100) to help meet temple needs through Dec. 31:

- \$51,000 from Enrichment Fund; offset operating expenses.
- \$28.3K from Hineni Fund; offset operating expenses.
- \$18.5K from Skuller-Cohen-Cerel Fund; Religious School family Shabbat dinners and curriculum.
- \$18K from Rosenstein Family Fund; offset Religious School expenses.
- \$17.2K from Marty Solomon Fund for Jewish Youth Experiences and General Fund Purposes; offset cost of LiveControl, youth education.
- \$12.1K from Betty Rosenthal Rabbinical Fund; offset operating expenses.
- \$11.6K from Temple Building Fund; chiller repair and architect fees for hallway leading to sanctuary.

- \$9.9K from Centennial Fund; offset operating expenses.
- \$5K Tikkun Olam Fund; Social Action Committee.
- \$3.6K from Sherman and Fannie Miller Memorial Fund; camp scholarships.
- \$3K from Dr. Victoria Greenberg Rabbinical Fund; offset cost of LiveControl.
- \$3K from Bloomfield Family Fund; offset cost of LiveControl.
- \$3K from Rose Family Trust; offset cost of LiveControl.
- \$2.5K from Music and Worship Fund; offset operating expenses.
- \$2K from Cindy Kline Fund; camp scholarships.
- \$1.1K from Perpetual Care Fund; care of nine gravesites at Lexington Cemetery.
- \$200 from Irving A. Gail Memorial Fund; Religious School operating expenses.
- \$200 from Maurice, Evelyn and Barbara Hymson Adult Education Trust Fund; programming expenses.
