Let’s actively embrace experiences rather than being affected by them.

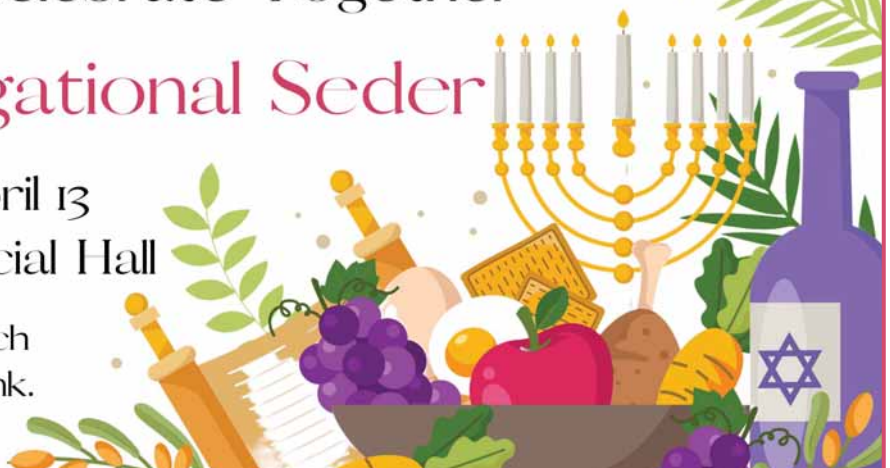

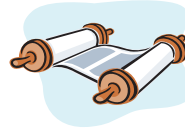
KOLLEL STUDY GROUP
